Eve care for seniors

Everyone who receives income or disability assistance gets specified optical services. Tell the eye clinic you are in receipt of assistance and give them your CareCard or your BC Services Card. They'll verify your coverage with Pacific Blue Cross.

When you receive assistance or medical services only, you can get:

- Up to \$48.90 for routine eye exams once every two years
- New eyeglasses, up to the Ministry's maximum rate
- New lenses if your eye doctor confirms a change in your prescription
- Necessary repairs to lenses or frames



Learn about your medicine or ask medical questions

UBC Pharm Sci now has a free pharmacy clinic online. Learn about your medicines in a 30 minute call.

Expert pharmacists at the clinic provide patients with the highest possible standard of health consultation services as they now have access to records to help support their patients.

Dental Health Resources for Seniors

The Emergency Dental Outreach Clinic 250-613-7246 is a place where individuals can have teeth removed if they are in pain. It is not drop-in during the Pandemic; right now are booking one to two months in advance. The program runs on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday evenings every month out of the Prince George Native Friendship Centre.

CNC (College of New Caledonia) Dental Hygiene program. 250-561-5810. It might be closing soon for the summer but during the college year, people can have their teeth cleaned for a flat rate of \$40 or \$50 dollars.

Social Assistance/Disability. If people are covered under either of these programs, they will have access to emergency care (pain control, usually in the form of extractions) at a Dental office. Again, balance billing will be involved as these programs pay out at a reduced rate.

NIHB (Non Insured Health Benefits) and PBC Dental Plan NIHB (Non-Insured Health Benefits) and PBC Dental Plan has coverage for Indigenous individuals. This plan will pay full or part of the dental for Indigenous individuals with a status card; it requires the individual to create an account. PBC is for BC Status Indigenous individuals; it may include funds for dentures.

Meals

Our meal program delivers over 170 individual frozen meals to seniors. It would not be possible without generous grants and donations from
